## 2024 Project AWARE Volunteer and Sponsor Summary Stats

- Paddled and removed trash from 60.4 miles of the Skunk River from Skunk Wildlife Area to Brighton Access, Brighton Access to Mac Coon Access, Mac Coon Access to Oakland Mills Access, Stephenson Park Access to Upper Skunk River Access.
- Alternative plans were implemented for Monday due to high river levels; these activities included invasive species removal, fly
  fishing, a bird hike, a mushroom hike, and paddling Lake Darling in a dugout canoe and regular canoes. The stretch of river from
  Faulkner's access to Stephenson Park Access was not completed, as a day needed to be removed from the schedule to account for
  being off the river on Monday.
- 269 participants registered for the event
- Daily average number of participants on the river 183. Number of volunteers on the water each day: Monday (220), Tuesday (219), Wednesday (183), Thursday (148), and Friday (144).
- In addition to Iowa, volunteers for this year's Project AWARE were from Colorado, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin.
- 79 (29%) of volunteers were first year volunteers; 15 volunteers were recognized for their 5<sup>th</sup> year on lowa Project AWARE; 10 participants were recognized for being on Project AWARE 10 years, and 4 participants were recognized for 15 years, and 6 participants were recognized for 20 years.
- Volunteers ranged in age from 5 to 82; 61 (23%) of this year's participants were 18 years or younger; 10 (4%) were 10 years of age or younger; 53 (20%) of the volunteers were age 62 or older.
- 122 participants were registered for all five days on the river.
- Participants included 35 members of the Conservation Corps of Iowa, including 6 as Iowa Project AWARE staff for the week. One AmeriCorps member through Bur Oak Land Trust who participated as staff.
- A total of 101 sponsors made this event possible through both monetary and in-kind donations. Grants supporting this year's event included: Cargill, Community Foundation of Des Moines County, Extreme Terrain Clean Trail, Greater Jefferson County Foundation, Hy-Vee, ITC Charitable Giving Program, Kwik Trip/Kwik Star, MidAmerican Energy Foundation, Prairie Meadows Community Betterment Grant Program, Riverside Casino & Golf Resort, Washington County Riverboat Foundation
- 35% of participants identified as beginners to paddling; 37% intermediate; and 28% as experienced
